


Book Review

Where the Crawdads Sing by Delia Owens

Made into a popular movie, first time fiction author Delia Owen scored an award-winning best seller, with a gothic Southern tale. Kya Clark, the rumoured "Marsh Girl," has grown up deep within the swamp, living as one with nature and shunning the residents of Barkley Cove. Having been abandoned by her family at a young age, Kya has learned to fend for herself, with the help of a kindly couple, Jumpin and Mabel. Her childhood friend, Tate, helps her learn about the world outside of the swamp.

Set in the 1950's and 60's, the story alternates timelines, from the lush and beautiful world of Kya's childhood to her doomed romance with hometown hero, Andrew Chase, whose death finds Kya on trial for her life. More than a coming-of-age story, the book mixes elements of suspense, mystery, sadness, and the healing power of nature.



Party Pairings - The Perfect Book/Recipe/Beverage: A Traditional English Tea

THE BOOK

Pride and Prejudice by Jane Austen

Numerous delightful film adaptations have been made of this classic novel, which involves the slow coming together of spirited but poor Elizabeth Bennett and the wealthy but prideful Mr. Darcy. Austen's eye for human nature, and careful observance of the society of her time, are still a joy to read two centuries later.



THE RECIPE

Lemon Posset (from The Great British Baking Show)

A posset dessert would be something that Jane Austen would know well. Posset recipes have been traced back to the 1400's and were even mentioned in Shakespeare.

1 1/3 cups 35% heavy cream

1/3 cup caster sugar

3-5 tbsp fresh lemon juice

Garnish: fresh berries, grated lemon zest, crushed nuts, crumbled hard cookies (ginger or shortbread)

DIRECTIONS

- 1) Place the cream and sugar in a medium sauce pan and bring to a simmer over medium-low heat.
- **2)** After it is simmering, reduce heat to low and let cook for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- **3)** After 5 minutes, remove from heat and quickly pour in 3 tbsp of lemon juice. The cream with sour and thicken.
- **4)** Taste and add more lemon juice if required.
- **5)** Pour into individual glasses, and chill for at least 3 hours. Add your choice of garnish(s) prior to serving.

THE DRINK

Afternoon Tea Punch (from Sweet Treats by Jean Paré)

1 cup white sugar

1 cup strong brewed black tea

4 cups orange juice

4 cups pineapple juice

4 cups prepared lemonade

1 (2 litre) bottle of ginger ale, chilled

Garnish: lemon slices or raspberries

DIRECTIONS

- 1) In a pitcher combine sugar and tea. Stir until dissolved. Stir in juices, and chill for 4 hours.
- **2)** Pour chilled mixture into punch bowl, and add ginger ale, prior to serving. Add garnish(s) if desired.
